Drive Begins To Register White Voters

The Montgomery Citizens Council Wednesday launched a campaign to register all white persons eligible to vote in Montgomery County.

Chairman Herbert Lancaster
Jr. said the move is designed to
counteract the mass Negro vote
registration drive sponsored by
the pro-integration Montgomery
Improvement Association.

The announcement of the white voter registration campaign was contained in a resolution unanimously adopted by council directors in a meeting at their new headquarters on Dexter avenue.

"We are particularly appealing to all young white men and women who are 21 years of age and over and have failed to register to vote," Lancaster said. He also urged current white voters to pay their poll taxes by Feb. 1, 1962.

REASONS LISTED

In its resolution, the council listed the following reasons for its action:

1. "Liberty, self-government and the preservation of the fundamental right of freedom of association is dependent upon the power of the ballot in our American democracy."

2. "Agitative influences alien to the State of Alabama are promoting the mass registration of Negroes in Montgomery County for the avowed purpose of promoting intermixture of the races and defeating causes and candidates who believe in segregation of the races."

The resolution added that all white citizens should register and pay their poll taxes so "they may be eligible to vote for states' rights and segregation and to combat Africanism and the NAACP hatchet boys in the public affairs of Montgomery and the state of Alabama."

It was signed by Lancaster, Ralph Syfrett, Frank Mizell, Bruce Wyatt, Hugh Adams, I. W. Hobbie Jr., W. R. Burt, W. T. Broxton, James McLean, Bert Ferguson, Simeon McNeill, Cad Beale, N. D. Sappenfield and Ed Chesnutt.
