## INFORMATION YOU MAY NEED

For persons voting on paper ballots needing help at the polls, the following law applies: Title 17, Section 359.

"If a qualified elector is unable to read or is so physically disabled that he cannot make his cross mark on a ballot, and request assistance in preparing his ballot, the inspector shall swear him as to such disability, and thereupon no more nor less than two inspectors shall assist such voter by one of them in the presence of the other inspector, marking his ballot as he directs. Each elector in preparing his ballot shall prepare the same in the room or place where such election is being held, and not elsewhere."

For persons living in counties where voting machines are used and for one reason or another need assistance at the polls, the following applies: Title 17, Section 107.

- 1. "He may request the assistance of two of the inspectors of his choice, or
- 2. He may choose some other person, who is not an election official, to assist him in voting. In the event the person elects to choose an individual to assist him in voting, he may not choose a person who has previously given assistance to some other voter in this regard."
