Sam Jones, C. T. Jernigan and Emory Folmar won decisive victories for seats on the eight-member City Democratic Executive Committee in Monday's election.

Two Negro candidates seeking committee seats were defeated, while a third, who did not appear on the ballot because he was unopposed, was automatically elected.

Jones, with 12,231 votes, was the winner in Ward 1 over Negro James Robinson, a veteran voter registration worker who had 4,635 votes.

Jones, father of Montgomery County state Rep. Fred Jones, is a retired disabled veteran. The incumbent in Ward 1, R. M. Taylor, did not seek re-election.

Jernigan, present committee vice chairman and longtime member, won the Ward 6 seat again, defeating West Powell, a Negro, by more than 4-1. Jernigan's vote was 14,464, Powell's 3,333.

Folmar, a Montgomery contractor and committee secretary-treasurer, won the Ward 23 seat with 13,55 votes, defeating Earl C. Pippin, a finance association director, who polled 5,267.

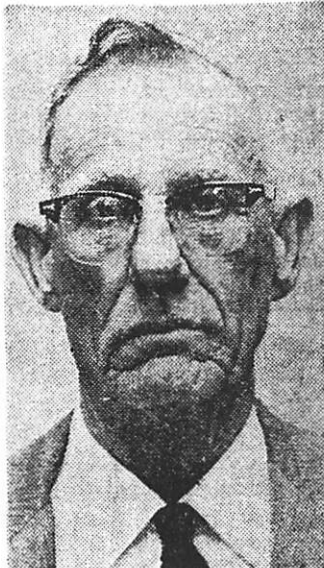
Folmar won the Ward 23 seat in 1967 by defeating Mrs. Norma (Leo L.) Brewer.

Five candidates, including four incumbents, ran without opposition.

Negro businessman Rufus A. Lewis will represent Ward 4.

The four unopposed incumbents are W. Paul Wooley, Linus J. Moeller, Leo Grant and D. H. "Chief" Coker.

Montgomery voters cast ballots for all three contested seats because, even though the committeemen were elected to ward seats, they were running citywide.—CATHY DONELSON
