
Former Chairman Hobbs discussed Precinct responsibilities with the new committee.

The committee voted 13 - 7 in favor of Mr. Johnson. The Secretary was instructed to officially notify Mr. Johnson that he was the Democratic nominee and to please let us know in writing of his acceptance.

It was moved that any two (2) officers of the committee could sign checks. Motion passed.


