Re: Funds needed for current operation

Dear County Leader:

The state-wide fall meeting of the Alabama Democratic Conference will be held in October at a time and place to be designated later. The Executive Committee is now preparing the program for that meeting. It is also preparing for an intensive effort to better functioning county organizations. We are counting heavily on the District Representatives to contribute substantially to this effort.

When this administration came into existence in April, it had no funds with which to operate. Since April, it has received only one hundred fifteen dollars (\$115.00). In order to be able to operate on a cash basis between now and October, the Executive Committee is requesting each county to make a financial contribution as soon as possible.

According to the best available information, there were in May, 1966, approximately 235,000 Negroes registered to vote in Alabama. The number in each of the 67 counties varied from 40 in Winston County to 61,000 in Jefferson County. If we got an average of one cent for each person registered, we would have \$2350.00, which ~~sum~~ would enable us to operate on a cash basis until the October meeting.

In order to secure the funds needed, the Executive Committee is urging each county to make a contribution as soon as possible. Enclosed is a list of the counties and the sum requested from each. The sum requested from each county is approximately \$7.00 per 1000 persons registered. The Macon County Democratic Club has already contributed the seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) requested of it. This generous contribution is appreciated (1) because it is the first to be made, and (2) because it is almost double the rate of \$7.00 per 1000 voters. Your county may draw its contribution from the treasury, as did Macon County, or it may lift collections from voters in each precinct, or it may assess each precinct a definite sum. Check your county for the sum expected from it.

Please send your contribution to Mr. R. D. Jones, Chairman of the Finance Committee, so that a proper record may be made. A proper financial report will be made at the October meeting.

Mr. Jones' address is enclosed on the sheet showing the list of officers of the Conference.
