Dear Mr. Wolter:

The materials forwarded with your May 12, 1969 letter relative to a proposed credit union to serve members of Montgomery County Democratic Conference are attached. From a review of this proposal and Ineligible Groups listed on Page 16 of our booklet "Organizing a Federal Credit Union", it would definitely appear that Montgomery County Democratic Conference does not constitute appropriate common bond to enable the chartering of a credit union to serve its members. While the group may not be "a political party group" in the exact nature of Item 5 of the referenced material, it seems to fully come within the ineligible one referred to in Item 15:

"The members of an association---such as a civic association, citizens' association, improvement association, or similar organization---which generally does not provide substantial benefits, specific objectives and associational activities that bind them together into a cohesive, permanent group which would make it economically advisable to charter a credit union."

I feel sure that you have one or more copies of this booklet already, but another copy of "Organizing a Federal Credit Union" is enclosed for your use.
