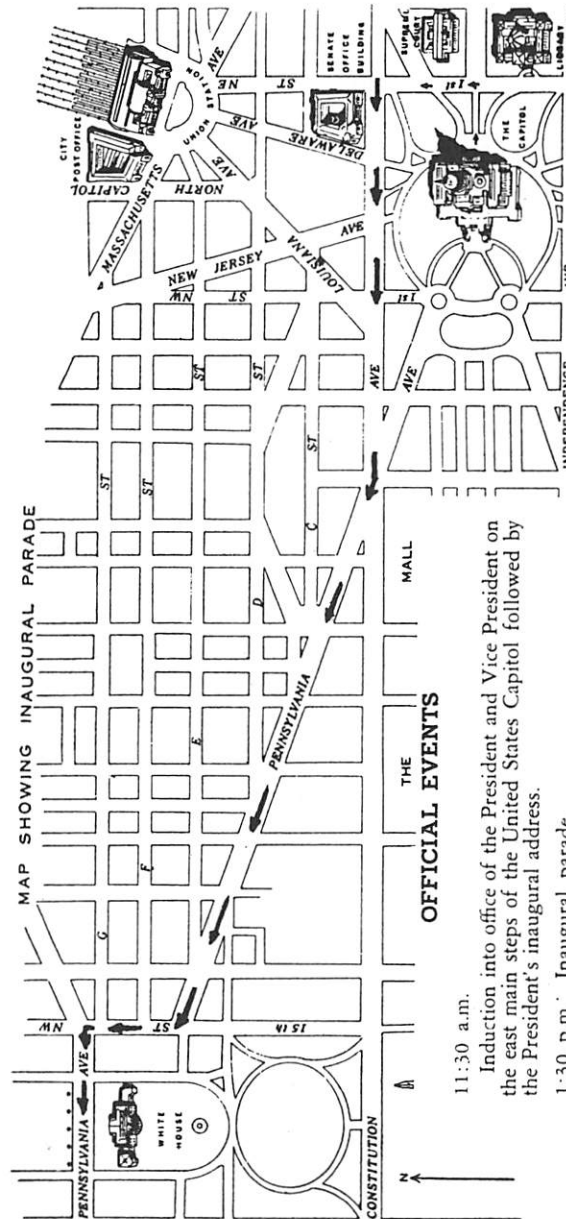

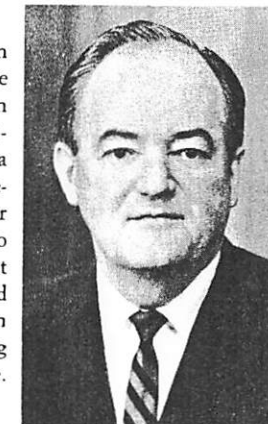

PRESIDENT LYNDON B. JOHNSON



Mr. Johnson was born near Johnson City, Texas, in 1908. He first came to Washington in 1931. He was elected Congressman in 1937, Senator in 1948, Vice-President in 1960 and President in 1964. Nearly all of his adult life has been spent in service to our government. He has passed through the national crises of depression and war to the highest position of responsibility.

VICE-PRESIDENT HUBERT H. HUMPHREY



Mr. Humphrey was born in Wallace, South Dakota. He was elected to the Senate in 1948 and elected Vice-President in 1964. He has been a champion of human rights, becoming involved while Mayor of Minneapolis from 1945 to 1948. Another area of interest has been foreign policy, and he was named to the Foreign Relations Committee during his first term in the Senate.

THE WONDERFUL PERSON OF JESUS CHRIST

Angels Accompanied Him

No person in all history has been accompanied by divine manifestation like Jesus Christ. He was miraculously conceived without a human father and this fact was announced by an angel to both Mary and Joseph. His birth was announced by angels and a heavenly host to the Shepherds. At His baptism, God the Father spoke saying, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." While on the cross darkness came over the earth for three hours. His sealed, guarded tomb is open and empty on the third day. A shining angel announces His resurrection. He appears many times to hundreds of people for the next 40 days. He disappears into heaven through a cloud while a multitude watches and angels announce He will some day come again.

Miracle Upon Miracle

For nearly three and one-half years he walked the highways of Palestine. Almost daily He performed miracles, healing all manner of diseases, giving sight to the blind, hearing to the deaf, raising the dead, feeding thousands with a boy's lunch, stilling the stormy waters of the Sea of Galilee and demonstrating His power over all creation.

Perfection Demonstrated

His enemies watched Him daily seeking to find one flaw in Him. He said to them, "Which of you convinceth me of sin?" When accused before him, Pilate stated three times, "I find no fault in him." Peter who lived intimately with Him for over three years said, "Who did no sin neither was guile found in His mouth." He is described as "a lamb without spot and without blemish." Paul states, "Who did no sin" and He was "Holy, undefiled, separate from sinners."

God in the Flesh

Jesus Christ said, "I and my Father are one." Philip said, "Show us the Father." Jesus said, "he that hath seen me hath seen the Father." Jesus said, "I proceeded forth and came from God; neither came I of myself, but He sent me." Jesus said, "O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was." John writes "And the Word (Jesus Christ) became flesh and dwelt among us." Paul writes, "Great is the mystery of Godliness. God was manifest in the flesh."
