Dear Mr. Andrews:

On March 3, 1972 I inspected the ballfields at Bellingrath and Goodwyn Community Centers. I found 25 quartz not burning at Goodwyn Babe Ruth Field. I feel this is due to a faulty wire. These bulbs cost \$8.75 each.

There are 13 incandescents on the Dixie Youth League Field burned out. These bulbs cost \$2.67 each.

Bellingrath Little League Field has 4 incandescents burned out and 19 incandescents on the Babe Ruth Field are not burning, which I feel is due to vandalism.

At Chisholm on Fulman Field 9 quartzs are not burning due to vandalism.

All total 34 quartzs and 36 incandescents need to be replaced. This will require man hours at \$6.50 per hour.

However, I will not take any action for repairs on the aboved mentioned until the Board reaches a decision.
