Dear Charlie:

The "Master Plan for Recreation" you developed in Greensboro for the City Council, Parks & Recreation Commission, and Council of Social Agencies, has been of untold value in the organization and promotion of recreation in our city. Only recently our City Manager, General James R. Townsend, stated that the plan had saved the City of Greensboro over \$50,000.00 by outlining a definite program to be followed, and that if the city adhered strictly to the program you outlined, that it would save the city additional dollars in its future plans for parks and recreation.

By the use of this plan we have been able to avoid duplication and overlapping of services, areas and facilities of the various agencies in our city. The plan has been a guide to selection and development of new areas and facilities to meet the need of existing conditions, as well as future needs of our community.

I have seen other plans you developed in many southern cities, and I have talked to many leaders in the field of parks and recreation, and they are all high in their praise of the work you are now doing for the communities in our section of the country.

In Greensboro we have recently had an opportunity to construct several shelter houses from plans and specifications drawn by your organization. They were the most complete set of drawings and specifications I have ever seen for a building of this type. The functional use of the building was just what we needed in our program. Every detail was carefully thought out in regards to operation, maintenance, program, etc.

I feel it is only sound planning to have someone like your organization to plan and recommend the proper type facilities for a community, rather than an organization that has had very little experience in the park and recreation field. I know that it is possible to save thousands of dollars on well-planned facilities and areas, not only on the initial cost but the savings in operation and maintenance costs over a period of years. I know that you have designed numerous facilities in our state and saved the organizations considerable money in the designing of useful facilities.

I wish to commend you and your organization for making such a worthwhile service available to the many communities in our southern states.


I have also been on the Morganton Recreation Foundation board, and several years ago we employed Mr. Graves on three assignments, namely:




