SENIOR SERVICE PROJECT:

1972 - 73 Budget Application attached. Please read the cover letter and let me hear from you before the Board meeting, if you have any questions or suggestions.

Program is now operating in six community centers besides Golden Age Club and Richardson Terrace

FREE FOOD PROGRAM:

Application was made for funds to be used for delivering food to Centers. We have not heard from it or from our application for food.

We are now preparing an application for commodities to supplement the food program.

RSP

No new developments. Guidelines have not been received. We are working on equipment lists, program details, revision of narrative and staff.

NYC

Request has been made to the Community Action Office for 38 enrollees - 19 girls and 19 boys. They will work 5 hours per day for nine weeks.

GIRL SCOUTS

The girl's day camp, originally scheduled for Washington Park, has been changed to meet in Oak Park so that more girl can be accommodated.

Date: August 7 - 11 90 girls

Second session: Date: August 14 - 18 90 girls, King's Hill

We have met with the Girl Scout Staff and the Senior Planning Board who will help with the camp. Most of the plans are complete.

ARTS COUNCIL:

In our meeting with the representatives from the Arts Council, these programs were planned:

Ballet lessons: June 19 - 30 Houston Hill for 100 children

Art lessons: Last week in June; last week in July and first week in August.

There will be 5 or 6 groups of children with 20 or 25 in each group.

KING'S HILL

Is there any possibility that we will be able to use the community center this summer? We are particularly concerned about the week of August 14 - 18, when the girl's day camp will be in session. Some arrangements will have to be made for the campers if it rains.

SUMMER PROGRAMS:

The programs from all of the centers and playgrounds are in and most of them are in good shape. We have problems in some areas, but are working them out with the help of the area supervisors.

TRAINING:

The training schedule is about complete. A copy will be sent to you as soon as it is finalized.

We have tried to make our report as brief as possible. This one has been confined to a progress report of the most important areas in which we are working.

SUBJECT: MONTHLY REPORT

One of the most effective ways of providing for the entire community to share in the promotion of common recreation interests and purposes is through the organization of Advisory Councils. To this end I have primarily devoted my efforts during the past month.

On Thursday, January 6, some fifteen citizens of the Washington Park community assembled at the Community Center to hear Board Members James Hall and Rufus Lewis. Subsequently, an Advisory Council was formed. It can provide the machinery by which the community and the recreational personnel can in a cooperative manner seek common goals.

After a survey of the Goode Street area I discovered widespread interest among the people in the success of the playground and feel that they have a stake in it. Many expressed the desire to work together on matters of mutual concern.

Plans for a Mass Meeting of citizens of the Goode Street area at Bellingrath Community Center on Monday evening, January 24, at 7:00 P.M., have been completed.
