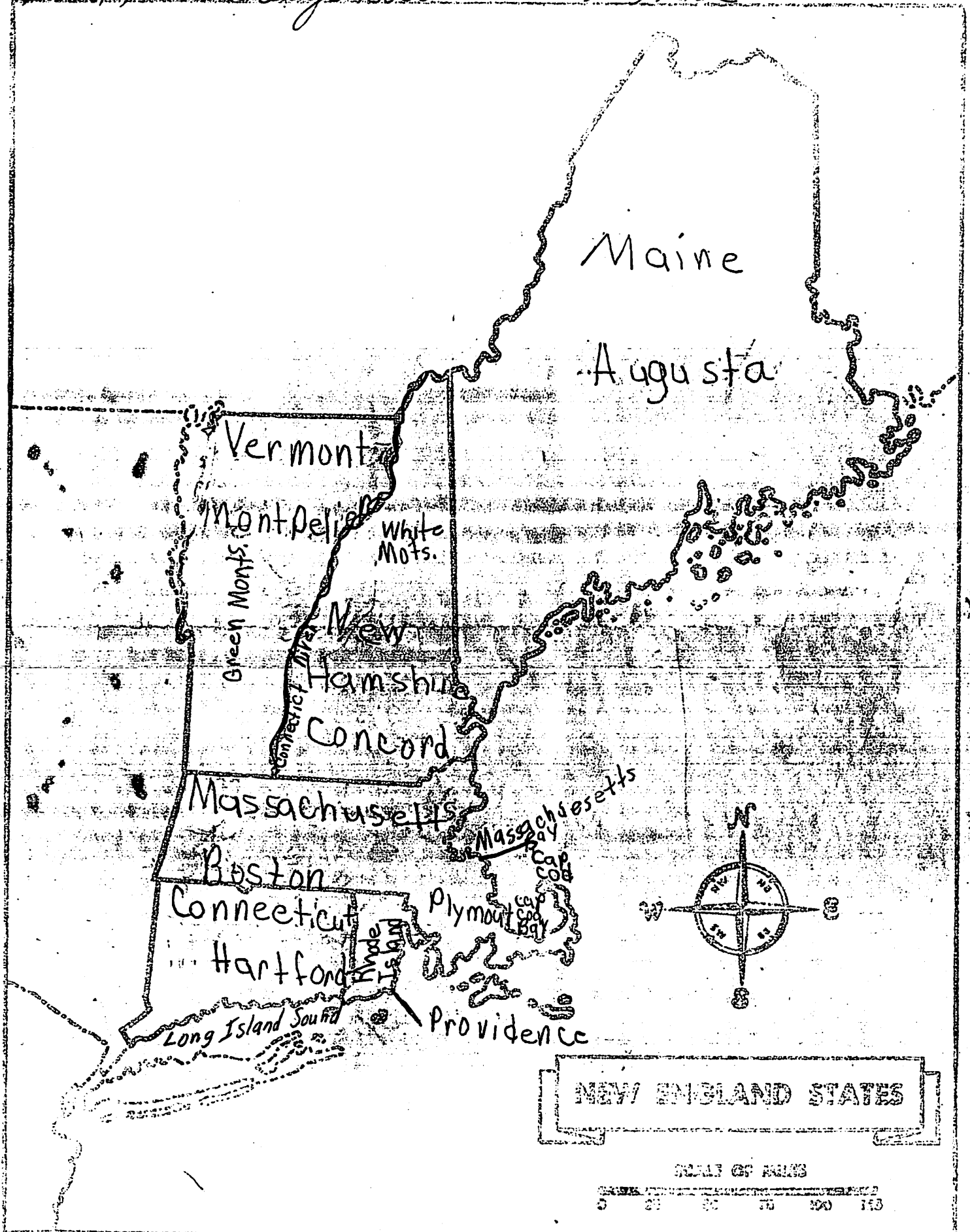

A Report on John Winthorpe

John Winthorpe was born in 1588 died in 1649. He studied at Trinity College at Cambridge. His earlier years were spent on his estate of Groton Manor, but his Puritan tendencies and the current of his political sympathies presently interested him in plans for colonization in America. When in 1629 a charter was obtained creating a corporation under the name of the Governor and Company of the Massachusetts Bay in New England, the piety, learning and talents of Winthorpe led to his election as Governor. Converting his hereditary estate, yielding an annual income of £600 or £700, into money he set sail in the Arabella from Yarmouth in March 1630, with ~~a~~ company of about 900 persons.

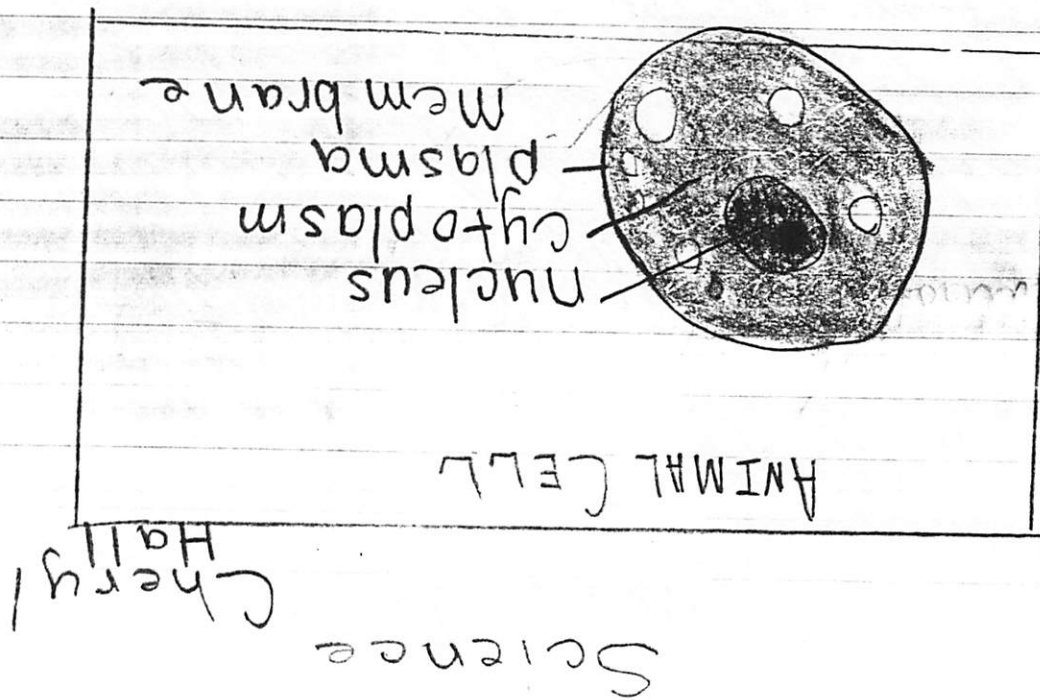
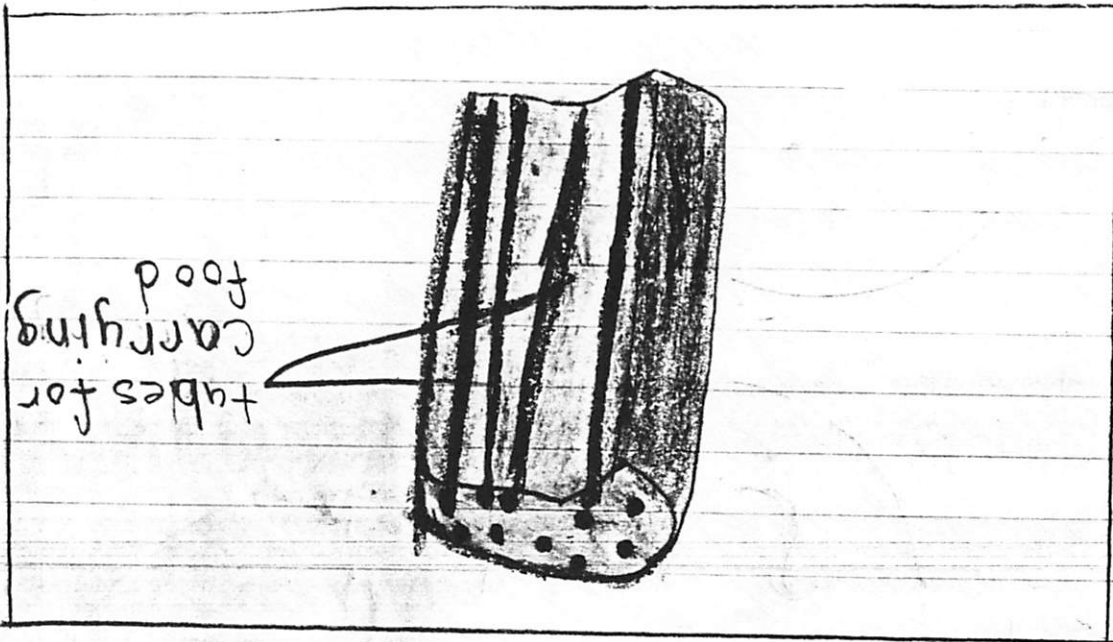

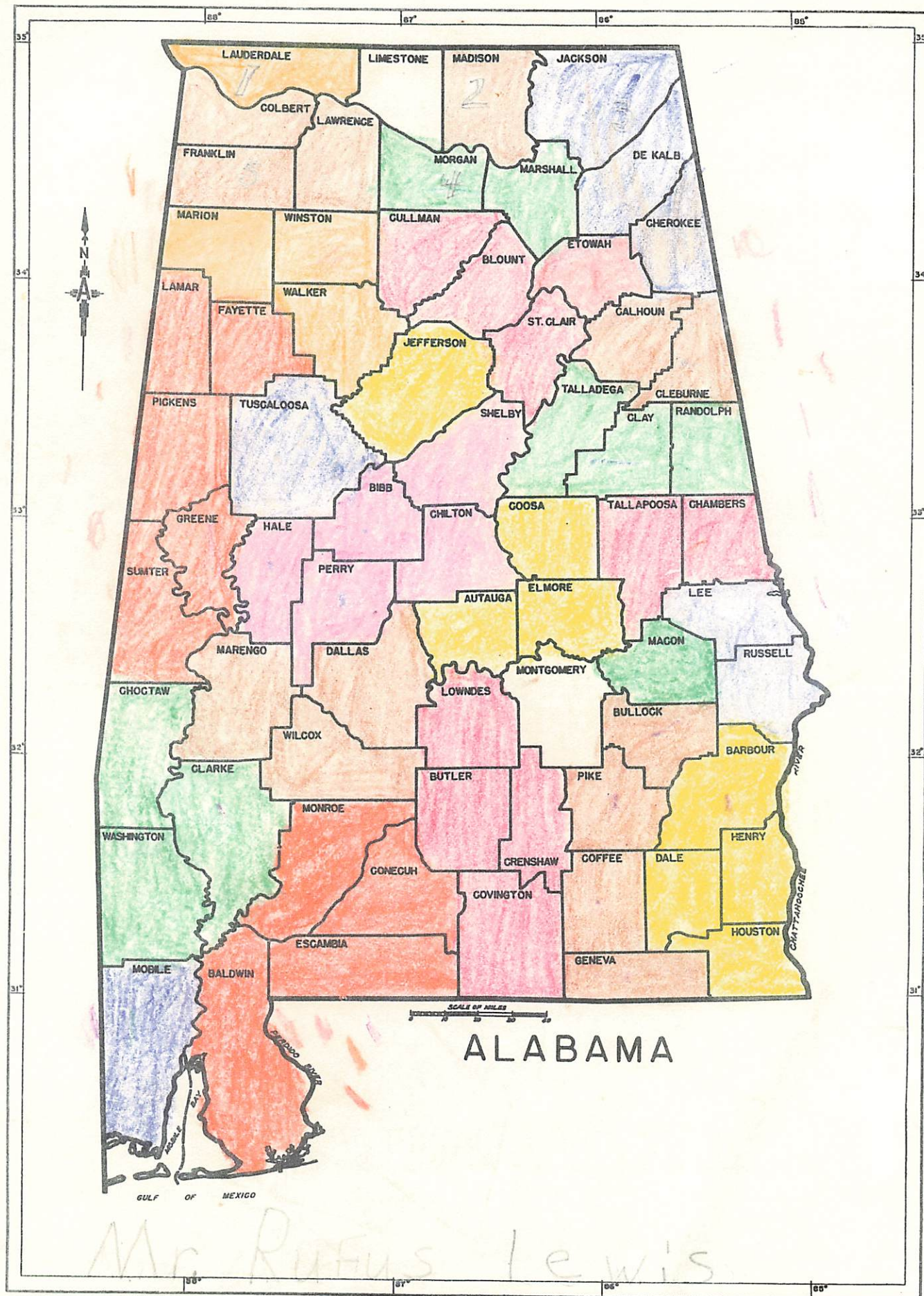
