OBITUARY

MRS. FRIZZETTE DUCKETTE LEE, the daughter of the late John and Emma Dawkins Duckette of Union, South Carolina and the wife of the late Clarence W. Lee, former owner and operator of C. W. Lee Funeral Home, expired at 8:00 a.m., Wednesday, August 3, 1983 at home, 686 West Jeff Davis Avenue.

She joined the St. John A.M.E. Church, Montgomery, in 1952. She served as President of the St. John Working Club for many years and was a member of the Board of Trustees for more than twenty-three years. She supported all church activities even during her illness. She gave flower donations for fifteen years to grace the altar.

She graduated from Second Ward High School, Charlotte, N.C. and received the Bachelor of Science and Master of Education Degrees from Alabama State University. She taught in the Alabama State Laboratory School for eleven years before retiring to assume the proprietorship of Lee's Funeral Home, upon the death of her husband in 1968. She received a diploma in Mortuary Science from the New York School of Embalming and Restorative Arts and worked with Payne's Funeral Home in New York City before moving to Alabama in 1947.

She was a member of the Board of Directors of the Cleveland Avenue Branch of the Y.M.C.A.; Chairman of the Fund Raising Committee and member of the Century Club; the Capital City Boy's Club; Montgomery Urban League; Served as Second Vice President of the Business and Professional Women's Club; member of the Westside Neighborhood Club; the Montgomery Chapter, Continental Societies, Inc.; Delta Sigma Theta Sorority; Camellia Home and Garden Beautification Club; the Agnes J. Lewis Federated Club; The Montgomery Area Chamber of Commerce; Montgomery Area Health Authority; the Ada Assembly No. 19, Order of the Golden Circle; Rising Star Lodge No. 7; Sophronia Chapter No. 496 O.E.S.; League of Women Voters; American Association of University Women; Sojourner Truth Federated Club and the Alabama Education Association. She also sponsored uniforms for Chisholm Boy's Club.

She was president of the Montgomery Area Funeral Directors' Association, Alabama State Board of Funeral Directors; Life Member of the Board of Directors of the National Funeral Directors Morticians Association; past president of the Ladies Auxiliary of the National Funeral Directors and Morticians Association; past treasurer of the 5th District of the NFDMA. She was chosen "Woman of the Year" in 1973 by the NFDMA and the Embalmer's magazine. This honor was bestowed upon her in Dallas, Texas.

She is survived by three sisters, Mrs. Alma D. Gilliam, Hartford, CT; Mrs. Inez D. Becknell, NY and Mrs. Dorothy D. Robertson, Anderson, SC; one brother, Rev. John Wilbur Duckette, Washington, DC; one adopted sister, Mrs. Marie K. Davis, Anderson, SC; two sisters-in-law, Mrs. Iredella Duckette, Columbia, SC and Mrs. Minnie Duckette, Washington, DC; two nieces; five nephews; one great niece; four great nephews; one great-great niece; two great-great nephews; and a host of other relatives and friends.
