

SCHOLARSHIP RESOURCES

In applying for scholarship aid, please observe the following rules:

1. Letter of application: The letter of application should be neat, brief and to the point. It should indicate your current status, future education plans, academic background, and a short statement of your financial position.
2. Application form: Check the application form thoroughly to be sure that you have answered each question honestly and accurately. A soiled and slovenly completed blank can create an unfavorable impression.
3. Personal Interview: Report for the interview on time and be neatly dressed. State your abilities, experience and educational plans in a favorable manner. Show enthusiasm for your career, but do not exaggerate.
4. References: Secure permission of prospective references before listing them on your application. Talk with each of your references and inform them of your interests, scholastic activities, and other helpful information about yourself.
